Educational Scholarship Program

Congratulations to all the recipients in Adams-Columbia's annual educational scholarship program. In 2017, a total of \$70,000 was awarded to 95 well qualified recipients. This is the 30th year ACEC has awarded educational scholarships.

In the long history of the program, 2,058 scholarships have been awarded with a combined value of \$1,080,000.

Funding for the annual scholarship program comes from unclaimed member patronage capital checks, and adds no cost to the members' electric bill. Scholarships are

available to adults and dependent children of all ACEC member families and are awarded based on need and excellence in academics, social and community service activities.

Scholarships are awarded in the amount of \$500, \$750, or \$1,000 each. Scholarships may be used in all fields of education from vocational to graduate studies. Photos of the recipients are available on our website. From the home page, you can follow an easy link to the photo pages.

Cooperative Partners

ACEC works everyday with several cooperative businesses. Here's a list of some of them, along with a description of the services they provide.

Cooperative Response Center (CRC) – In 1992 ACEC was one of 12 founding cooperative members of this 24hour contact center. CRC provides many services, including after-hours dispatch, 24-hour customer care, and monitoring of security and medical alarms.

Federated Rural Electric Insurance Exchange (FREIE) - Organized in 1959 by Wisconsin electric and telephone cooperatives, Federated provides property, casualty, and liability insurance for hundreds of cooperatives throughout 42 states. Now headquartered in Kansas, Federated has become a premier and industryleading insurance provider.

Marquette-Adams Telephone Cooperative (MAQS) – Based in Oxford, this telephone cooperative has made significant investments to improve and expand its state-of-the-art fiber optic network. MAQS provides ACEC with high-speed Internet service.

National Rural Utilities Cooperative Finance Corporation (CFC) – With Midwestern roots, this nationwide cooperative started in 1969. CFC is a non-profit finance cooperative with approximately \$20 billion in assets. They ensure electric cooperatives have access to the market rate loan funds they need to grow and expand.

Rural Electric Supply Cooperative (RESCO) – This Wisconsin-based cooperative is headquartered in Madison and provides electrical distribution supplies such as transformers, and all types of wire and line equipment to utilities in an eight-state area.

Hurricane Irma Relief Effort

At our magazine deadline, Hurricane Irma was making her way through Florida and northward into bordering states. In her wake was a path of destruction and millions left without electric service. Wisconsin's electric cooperatives wasted no time in organizing a response by sending experienced line technicians, trucks and materials to help with the rebuilding efforts. ACEC sent six volunteers to assist at Clay Electric Cooperative in Keystone Heights, Florida. More volunteers are waiting to replace them in a couple of weeks.
