PATRONAGE CAPITAL REFUNDS

WHAT IS PATRONAGE CAPITAL?

The revenue that ACEC generates is used to cover the cost of operating the co-op. Any remaining profits, called 'margins', are then divided between members based on usage. This is called patronage capital and represents the amount of ownership you have in the cooperative. Each year we refund a portion back to members. Those members receiving a refund will see the credit on their November bill.





MEMBER'S ECONOMIC PARTICIPATION

Members contribute equally to the capital of the cooperative, and have democratic control. This benefits members in proportion to the business they conduct with the cooperative rather than on the capital invested.



What does this mean? Profits and earnings generated by the cooperative are distributed among the members.

ACEC does not exist to generate profits for a group of investors. We are member-owned.

ACEC'S ANNUAL TOY DRIVE



ACEC's annual toy drive is fast-approaching. This year ACEC is partnering with the Marine Toys for Tots Program. We will be a drop site for new, unwrapped toys which will be distrubted to families in need within our service territory.

In 2016, we were able to provide over 1,000 toys for children to unwrap on Christmas morning! We're looking forward to bringing joy to lots more families this year!
