This grant would bring a dedicated network to our coop. What does that mean? Well, it would bring additional security to the co-op's communications—a one-way form of communication that wouldn't allow outside access to information. We've taken many precautions over the years to keep your personal information as safe as possible. With all the hacks and data breaches we hear about in the news on a daily basis, this can be a formidable task. This grant is simply the next step we are taking to continue on that

When many think broadband, they think internet. Broadband is actually the high-capacity transmission technique that enables a large number of messages to be communicated simultaneously.

The long-term goal with this grant is to provide broadband communications to each of our substations. This would mean better SCADA (Supervisory Control And Data Acquisition) communications and surveillance, and it would open the door for an AMI (Advanced Metering Infrastructure) system. And lastly, a long-term goal is for Marquette-Adams to expand their internet offerings to more communities.

USE A FAN TO HELP COOL DOWN

Use a ceiling fan to help circulate the air. Turn off the AC and and use a window fan on cool evenings. Remember, fans cool people, not places. Be sure to turn it off when you leave the room to save energy.



CLEAN FILTERS

Clean or replace Air Conditioner filters monthly for more efficient operation.



KEEP THE BLINDS AND WINDOWS CLOSED DURING THE DAY AND **OPEN AT NIGHT**

For an added benefit, invest in energy efficient, insulating & blackout curtains.



SET YOUR THERMOSTAT TEMPERATURE A LITTLE HIGHER



The hotter it is outside, the harder your air conditioner has to work to keep your home cool. Keep temps a little higher to save money.

RUN THE DRYER AND DISHWASHER AT NIGHT





On hot days run the dryer and dishwasher at night. Let your dishes air dry and hang your clothes out on the line.

AVOID USING THE OVEN ON HOT DAYS

Instead of using the oven, try using a microwave, toaster oven, or grill.


We give where we live Operation Round-Up®


