She joined members and employees of Adams-Columbia Electric Co-op (ACEC) for Fall Fest, celebrating co-op month. Members were asked to bring a non-perishable food item for the Fall Fest Food Drive.

As Lee lowered the lift gate, Waushara County Food Pantry's youngest volunteer, Mia, age 9, helped load the back of the truck with food donations. Thanks to ACEC members, a total of 1,025 pounds of food were collected.


"People are very generous, and that's the heart and spirit of this community," says Lee, who has been the Waushara County Food Pantry Food Director for the last five years. "Personally, I am a member (of ACEC)... what I have found since I've been involved with the food pantry, is that anytime I have called – whether it was for a grant, food, or just questions - you have responded with help."

The Waushara County Food Pantry helped 9,109 families in 2018. Lee explains the majority of people that use the food pantry do so for a short period of time. "Quite often people think that it's just the same people that come every time, and that's not true. Big events cause people to use us for short amounts of time. All of a sudden you break your leg and you're out of work for three months. So quite often when we see people for the first time, it's due to a crisis," explains Lee.

Lee says the food pantry is a success because of three things: "Our customers, our volunteers, and our donors. And it takes all three – many ACEC members are our donors."
