Riverside

Another important past mention is our cooperative's investment in Alliant's West Riverside Energy Center. We are awaiting the completion of this highly efficient natural gas facility, which has a scheduled completion date of 2019. Riverside will emit less than half of the carbon dioxide, two-thirds less nitrogen. and 99 percent less sulfur and mercury than traditional coal-fired facilities. ACEC has purchased 30-megawatts of ownership in this facility with the hopes of helping to stabilize rates in the future. We will also own 80kW of the new solar array garden being built at Riverside.

Attend monthly board meetings




