

As a cooperative, we love to give back to our communities through a variety of programs we offer. You may know a few employees from the co-op because we're local people. When you call us or see our workers, you know you're working with people who live in the same community as you. And unlike big investor-owned utilities, we don't keep our profits. We return profits back to our members through patronage capital, which you can read more about on the back side of this newsletter.

PATRONAGE CAPITAL RETIREMENTS

The board of directors has approved \$2.2 million in patronage capital retirements (refunds) this year. We will be retiring patronage capital from the years 2001, 2002, and a portion of 2003. This means if you were on our lines during those years and accrued patronage capital, you may see a refund on November's bill statement.

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY ENGINEERING, & MATH

Our STEM Grant is available for public, public charter, private, home school, Christian schools, and organizations in our service area for classrooms with students K-12. The classroom project must be academically focused in the areas of science, technology, engineering or math. The grant may be used to purchase equipment or curriculum materials and should be part of a well-planned curriculum.
