SAFETY MESSAGE

Thankfully, lengthy outages do not happen on a regular basis. That does not mean you should not prepare for them. We suggest that you:

- Have a storm kit ready that includes flashlights, bottled water, non-perishable food, battery-operated radio, batteries, portable cell phone chargers that are fully charged, hand sanitizer and first-aid supplies.
- Have alternate plans for refrigerating or accessing medicines and using power-dependent medical
- Find out where your local storm shelters are and have a plan for getting there if needed and it is safe to do so.



DIRECTOR QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be a full-time resident and member in good standing in the director district from which he or she has been nominated.
- Cannot be employed by or financially interested in a competing enterprise or business selling energy or supplies to the cooperative.
- Cannot have been in default on any obligations to the cooperative in the preceding 12 months.
- Cannot have been employed in any capacity by the cooperative within five years of the date of the election.
- Cannot be an incumbent of, or candidate for, an elective county, state, or federal office filled by election on a party ticket.
- Cannot have been convicted of any felony or of any other offense involving a breach of trust.


