## WHAT A YEAR IT'S BEEN!

We're proud of the great team we have at ACEC, and we've accomplished a lot this year. Below are a few points worth mentioning that impacted our membership in 2021.



#### WEST RIVERSIDE ENERGY CENTER (WREC)

Alliant Energy's WREC natural gas power plant started to operate in late 2020, as you may recall we have a 4.8% ownership of this plant. Because we have ownership in WREC, we receive a credit from Alliant each month. Our ownership credit has helped to reduce the purchase power bill we pay to Alliant each month. Fluctuations of purchased energy costs, either up or down, are reflected on members' bills in the Power Cost Adjustment (PCA). For the average residential bill, the ownership credit has helped to reduce the energy cost by roughly \$2.80 per month for an average residential member with 500 kilowatt-hours billed usage.

Due to low energy costs and the ownership credit combined, the PCA has been a credit for most of 2021. Recently, natural gas prices increased, driving an increase in the cost to produce electricity. This resulted in the PCA now being a charge rather than a credit. The WREC credit continues to offset the cost to purchase power and overall helps to minimize the rising energy costs that impact your bill.



#### **COMMUNITY 5K & FUN DAY EVENT**

It was great to see our members in person again at our co-op month event. Over 100 racers participated in our 5K and enjoyed live music and food trucks. Additionally, attendees donated \$232 and 323 pounds of food to the local food pantry in Adams. We're anxious about the 2022 events we have in store for you.



#### PATRONAGE CAPITAL (YOUR OWNERSHIP IN THE CO-OP)

We're proud to say we refunded over \$4.8 million to our members this year. Every member accrues patronage capital. Each year, our board of directors determines the amount to refund to our members while making sure we still have enough funds on hand to operate.

In June, the board refunded \$2.5 million to members that had service with us in 2020 and in November, they refunded \$2.3 million to members that had service with us in 2003 and 2004. This is one of the perks that separates us from investor-owned utilities.

We had the pleasure of welcoming Adam Jones, representing district 2, to our board of directors at our annual meeting in May. Those of you that live in districts 3 and 5, start thinking about if you'd like to join our board. We'll start accepting nominations by petition and advisory resolutions on January 1 with a deadline of February 18.



## SAFETY MESSAGE

Before you plan out your new holiday lighting scheme or repeat last year's festive design, keep these safety tips in mind when decorating outdoors:

Don't toss light strands in the air as they could come into contact with a power line. Before using a ladder, always know where overhead power lines are located. Don't use staples, nails, or tacks to secure light strands, cords, wires, or extension cords. Keep at least 10 feet between yourself and any item you're holding, and a power line.

## **SCANDINAVIAN ALMOND BARS**

PREP TIME - 30 MINS | COOK TIME - 15 MINS

## **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 3/4 c flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 c butter, softened
- 1 c sugar
- 1 egg
- 1/2 tsp almond extract
- 2 Tbsp milk
- 1/2 c sliced almonds



#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. In a small bowl, sift together flour, baking powder, and salt; set aside.
- 2. In a mixing bowl, beat together softened butter and sugar. Beat in egg and almond extract until combined.
- 3. Beat in flour mixture. This mixture will be crumbly but will get better as you work with it.
- 4. Divide dough into four equal portions. Shape each portion into a 12-inch long roll. Place two rolls 4 to 5 inches apart on a parchment-covered cookie sheet. Flatten each roll until it is 3-inches wide.
- 5. Brush flattened (3"x12") logs with milk; sprinkle with almonds.
- 6. Bake at 325 degrees for 12-15 minutes, or until edges are lightly brown.
- 7. While still warm and soft on the cookie sheet, cut each cookie "slab" diagonally into 1-inch wide strips. Carefully transfer cookies to a wire rack and let cool.
- 8. Drizzle with almond icing; let dry.

### **ALMOND ICING**

- 1 c sifted powdered sugar
- 1/4 tsp almond
- 3-4 tsp milk (to make drizzle consistency)

Stir together sifted powdered sugar, almond extract, and enough milk to make drizzling consistency.

Store cookies in an airtight container.

These cookies are even better after they sit overnight.
