The deadlines are February 1, May 1, August 1, and November 1. Applications are reviewed quarterly after these deadlines.

Funding is available for public, public charter, private, Christian schools, home schools, and organizations in our service area for classrooms with students K-12.



## **HOMEMADE CHICKEN & DUMPLINGS**

## **INGREDIENTS**

#### **Chicken Recipe Ingredients:**

- 3 lbs chicken
- 2 Tbsp vegetable oil
- 2 stalks celery, cut into 1/2" pieces
- 1 1/2 c chopped onion
- 3 cubes chicken bullion
- 3 c water

- 1 bay leaf
- 1/4 tsp black pepper
- 6 carrots cut into 1/2" pieces
- 1/3 c flour
- 1/2 c cold water (in addition to the 3 cups listed above)

## **Dumpling Ingredients:**

PREP TIME - 90 MINS COOK TIME - 75 MINS

- 1 1/2 c flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 salt
- 1/2 nutmeg
- 1 tsp parsley
- 2/3 c milk
- 1 egg slightly beaten
- 2 tsp vegetable oil

## **INSTRUCTIONS**

#### **Chicken Instructions:**

- 1. Brown chicken in vegetable oil in a large pan with a lid.
- 2. Add all of the next six ingredients to the pan of chicken.

  Bring to a boil and let simmer for an additional 25 minutes.
- 3. Add the carrots to the pan and simmer until tender (about 20 minutes)
- 4. Remove the chicken from the pan. Dissolve flour and water (1/2 cold water) add to the juice mixture in the pan to thicken.
- 5. Once thickened, add the chicken back to the pan. Time to make the dumplings.

#### **Dumpling Instructions:**

- 1. Add the dumpling ingredients to a large bowl and mix until moist.
- 2. Take a teaspoon and drop dumplings into the pot of chicken. Put a lid on and simmer for 18 minutes.
- 3. Time to enjoy this wonderful meal!
