VOLUNTARY & OPEN MEMBERSHIP

CO-OP PRINCIPLE #1

Cooperatives are voluntary organizations open to all persons able to use their services and willing to accept the responsibilities of membership, without gender, social, racial, political or religious discrimination.



DEMOCRATIC MEMBER CONTROL

CO-OP PRINCIPLE #2

Cooperatives are democratic organizations controlled by their members, who actively participate in setting policies and making decisions.

The elected representatives are accountable to the membership. Members have equal voting rights (one member, one vote).

MEET OUR CONTRACTORS

ACEC works with a variety of highly skilled contractors. Below are a few contractors you may see working on our system, or within our service area. When you see crews from these companies, they are working on our behalf to help us provide the best service possible for you, our members.

KARCZ UTILITY SERVICES

Karcz takes care of maintaining our underground equipment and our pole testing.

This year, they'll be working on underground equipment in the Quincy, Columbus, and Richford areas. Pole testing will be done in the Plainfield, Coloma, and Lewiston areas.



ALLEN STEELE CO. INC.

They're the starting point for the majority of new services we install. They typically arrive a day or so before our crews complete their work.

When our crews arrive, we wrap up the installation of service.

Located in Baraboo, they travel throughout our service area to help us with cable plowing.



4CONTROL

4Control helps tackle the vegetation jobs which include herbicide spraying.

You may see their crews walking along our right-of-ways and near our substations.

They help us overcome some of the challenges our crews face with invasive plants in our service area, like poison ivy.



ZIELIES

Zielies crews work on a different level of our vegetation management than 4Control by trimming trees in our area.

Trees can cause quite the hazard if they are too close to our overhead power lines or other equipment. Their crews help manage the distance of trees near our distribution system.



JON STEINHAUS LINEWORKER SCHOLARSHIP

LOBBYING FOR OUR MEMBERS


