



FALL INTO FINENCES



HVAC SYSTEM AIR FILTER


Check your air filter every month, especially during heavy use months. If the filter looks dirty, change it. At a minimum, change the filter every three months. A dirty filter slows down airflow and makes your system work harder to keep you comfortable.

INSULATE PIPES

Insulate hot water pipes as well as the first 5-10 feet of cold water supply to the water heater.

SEAL AIR LEAKS WITH CAULK

Applying caulk around windows, doors, electrical wiring and plumbing can save energy and money. There are many different types of caulking compounds available, but the most popular choice is silicone. Silicone caulk is waterproof, flexible, and won't shrink or crack.

SAFETY MESSAGE

It is best to familiarize yourself with how to use a generator properly before needing one as there are important lifesaving safety steps you should know. Before using a portable generator, be sure to:

- 1. Read the instructions. Many people are tempted to skip this step, but incorrectly using a generator can cause carbon monoxide poisoning, which is often deadly.
- 2. Operate generators at least 20 feet from doors and windows and never use one in any type of enclosed structure, such as a garage, shed, or tent.
- 3. Let the generator cool down before refueling. Also, store fuel safely.

TACO CASSEROLE PREP TIME - 15 MINS | TOTAL TIME - 30-40 MINS

INGREDIENTS

- 2 12 oz cans of tomato paste
- 1 16 oz can of refried beans
- 1 1/2 lbs of burger
- 1 9.75 oz bag of Doritos (taco or nacho flavor)
- 1 package of taco mix
- 2 cups of shredded cheddar or Mexican blend cheese
- salt and pepper to taste
- Optional add 1/2 chopped onion to burger when cooking

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. In a large pan over medium-high heat, fry burger, salt, pepper, and onion (optional). When done, shut off the stove and add one can of tomato paste and taco mix. Stir and set aside.
- Spray Pam in a casserole dish or crock pot. Add 1 to 1 1/2 cups crushed Doritos to the bottom of the dish. Pour burger mixture over crushed Doritos.
- 3. In a medium bowl, mix refried beans and one can of tomato paste. Mix and spread on top of the burger mixture. Top with 1 cup crushed Doritos, then add shredded cheese.
- 4. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-40 minutes, or cook in a crock pot on high for 1 to 1 1/2 hours, then turn to medium or low until serving.
