4 KEY FACTORS

That Impact Energy Bills

You pay for the electricity you consume each month, but there are additional factors that impact your energy bills.



Fuel Costs

Before electricity can be delivered to your home, it must first be generated at a power plant or from a renewable source. The cost of fuels used to generate electricity fluctuates, which is why you see a power cost adjustment on your monthly bill. This monthly calculation may be a charge or a credit, and covers cost fluctuations without having to continually restructure rates.



Service Costs

Your bill includes a monthly facility charge, which recovers part of the ongoing investments in poles, wire, meters, system maintenance, and additional costs necessary to provide electric service.




Weather

When temperatures soar or dip, your cooling or heating equipment must run longer and at maximum capacity, which greatly increases your energy usage. Extreme temperatures can also affect electricity market prices. When the need for electricity increases due to extreme heat or cold, the price of power typically rises.



Energy Consumption

This is the amount of electricity you use each month to power your home's cooling/heating system, appliances, lighting, electronics, and more. The amount of electricity you consume is measured in kilowatt-hours, or kWh. You have control over how much energy you use, which can ultimately help manage your monthly costs.

SAFETY MESSAGE

Harvest will be starting soon for many farmers in our area. Be aware of where tractors are at in relation to our equipment, including overhead power lines, poles, and underground equipment. Here are a few safety tips to keep in mind while harvesting crops this year:

- Use a spotter when operating large machinery near power lines
- Inspect the height of farm equipment to determine clearance
- Look up & use care when moving equipment, such as raising the bed of grain trucks around power lines
- Always set extensions to the lowest setting when moving loads to prevent contact with overhead lines

august is peach month

EASY PEACH COBBLER

INGREDIENTS

- 6 large peaches, thinly sliced
- 1 1/2 tsp lemon juice
- 3/4 c flour
- 1/4 c sugar
- 1/4 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp baking soda
- 1/4 tsp salt

PREP TIME - 10 MINS **COOK TIME - 30 MINS**

- 1/4 c melted butter
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- Vanilla ice cream, for serving

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°F and grease a 9" x 13" baking dish.
- 2. Layer the peaches into the bottom of the baking dish and drizzle the lemon juice over the peaches.
- 3. In a medium bowl, mix the flour, sugar, cinnamon, baking soda, and salt. Add the melted butter and vanilla extract, and combine until the mixture forms a crumbly dough. Sprinkle over the peaches and bake for 30 minutes, or until the mixture is just lightly browned on top and the peaches are juicy.
- 4. Serve warm with vanilla ice cream.
