

CORNED BEEF

PREP TIME - 30 MINS **COOK TIME - 3 HOURS** INGREDIENTS


- 1 corned beef brisket (3-4 lbs)
- 14.5 oz can of beef stock
- 1 1/2 lbs baby potatoes
- 3 large carrots
- 1/2 head cabbage, cut into wedges
- 3 Tbsp butter
- salt and pepper
- 2 Tbsp pickling spice
- 2 bay leaves
- 1/4 c fresh parsley


INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place the corned beef in a large stock pot. Add spice packet if your corned beef came with one, or add 2 Tbsp pickling spice and 2 bay leaves.
- 2. Add beef stock and water to cover beef completely.
- 3. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, and cover. Simmer 45-50 minutes per pound (until meat is fork tender). Approximately 2 1/2 - 3 1/2 hours.
- 4. Once tender, remove meat from the pot and cover (reserve the cooking liquid, this will flavor your vegetables). Place corned beef in a 250°F oven to keep warm.
- 5. Bring the corned beef water back up to a boil. Add in vegetables and cook an additional 20-30 minutes or until tender.
- 6. Place vegetables in a large bowl and toss with butter. Add parsley to taste.
- 7. Slice the corned beef against the grain.


