SAFETY MESSAGE

Whether planting trees to provide a wind break, shade, reduce carbon in the environment, or beautify your landscape, ACEC reminds everyone of the importance of planting tall-growing trees safely away from power lines.

- Tall-growing trees with a mature height greater than 45 feet should be planted at least 45 feet away from lines to avoid future pruning.
- Do not plant near underground utility equipment. Tree roots can grow to interfere with underground pipes, cables, and wires.
- Keep areas around electric meters, transformers, or other electrical equipment free of any vegetation that could limit utility service access.

5 WAYS TO SAVE THIS SUMMER

When summer temperatures rise, so do our energy bills. Here are a few ways you can reduce energy use and grow your summer savings:



Raise your thermostat. The smaller the difference between the indoor and outdoor temp, the more you'll save.



Install window coverings like blinds or lightblocking curtains to prevent indoor heat gain during the day.



Seal leaks with caulk and weatherstripping around windows and exterior doors.



Run ceiling fans for additional cooling but turn them off when you leave the room.



Lower your water heater thermostat to 120 degrees to reduce standby heat loss.

YOUR GUIDE TO POWER OUTAGES

CONFIRM YOUR OUTAGE

If you overload a circuit, you may trip a breaker in your home or business, which can be mistaken for a power outage. Check your breakers and fuses to ensure the problem is not within your electric system. ACEC facilities end at the meter, so if you have a power issue within your home, contact a licensed electrician to make the necessary repairs. We also recommend checking with your neighbors to see if they're experiencing an outage too. If they are also without power and you believe the problem is on our distribution system, your next step is to report the outage.

REPORT THE POWER OUTAGE

There are two ways you can report power outages:

- 1. Give us a call on our 24/7 power outage line at (888) 928-2232.
- 2. Log in to your SmartHub account and click "Report an Issue/Inquiry". SmartHub will walk you through the steps of reporting an outage and tie the outage directly to your location, so our linemen know where to get started.

MONITOR THE POWER OUTAGE

View our outage map viewer on our website at www.acecwi.com to see where power outages are located, how many members are without power, and any comments our operations department can include about restoring the outage.

It can be difficult for our crews to give an estimated restoral time as they need to first assess the problem/damage, determine the equipment needed for the repair, call in additional crews if the work requires more helping hands, and get to work restoring power.

Examples of power outage causes may include trees on power lines, car accidents, weather, animals, and equipment failure.

SAFETY IS OUR NUMBER ONE PRIORITY

It may seem easy to restore power, however, our crews are held to high safety standards to ensure they are getting the job done in a safe and efficient manner. Crews must wear personal protective equipment (PPE) for the work they do and have procedures in place for restoring power outages.

If you see trees on power lines, downed power lines, or damaged utility equipment, stay away and never go near them as they may still be energized. Give us a call at (800) 831-8629 and we'll get a crew dispatched as soon as we can.

EASTER BASKET DONATIONS


