#### SAFETY MESSAGE

Using a portable generator in a home, garage, or too close to an enclosed area is like starting a parking lot full of cars and letting the carbon monoxide (CO) poison seep into that area. The devastating result is almost immediate: The CO from one generator can kill in minutes. To use a portable generator safely:

- Always use a portable generator at least 20 feet away from your home.
- Never operate one inside a home, on a porch, or near windows and doors.
- When shopping for a generator, look for one that gives off reduced emissions. Look for one that shuts off automatically when high levels of CO are present.

## **Step 1: Getting Started**

## **Step 2: Claim Your Rebate**

Through our partnership with Focus on Energy, members have access to claim \$300 per system for a single-family home. Rural residential members can receive an additional \$300 for installing a system.

## **Step 3: Review Our Rates**

Our solar rate is called "Banked" NET Metering. Any generation from the solar system will offset your consumption at a 1 kilowatt-hour (kWh) for 1 kWh rate. If your system generates more energy than you consume, it will be added to your "bank". This bank will either build or reduce depending on your solar system's generation and your energy consumption. If there are any kWh's in your "bank" at the end of your April billing, the kWh's in your "bank" are paid out to you at the avoided cost.

District 1- Derek Alexander received 22 in person votes, 321 online votes, and 11 absentee votes for a total of 354.


Winner for District 1 - Derek Alexander


