5 WAYS TO REDUCE USE DURING EXTREME HEAT

During periods of extreme heat, the demand for electricity can skyrocket, placing additional strain on the grid. By working together to lower our electricity use, we can reduce pressure on the grid.

- 1. Raise your thermostat setting a few degrees higher than usual.
- 2. Cook with smaller appliances to save energy.
- 3. Keep blinds, curtains, and shades closed during the hottest part of the day.
- 4. Use fans to circulate air. which can make you feel cooler without needing to lower the thermostat

5. Shift energy usage to off-peak hours when demand is lower.

SUMMER STUFFED SHELLS

PREP TIME - 30 MINS | TOTAL TIME - 1 HOUR

INGREDIENTS

- 1 12 oz package jumbo shells
- 1 Tbsp oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 zucchini, chopped into 1/2" pieces
- 3 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 c ricotta
- 1/2 c grated Parmesan

• 1 c corn kernels

- 1/4 c basil leaves, chopped
- 1 1/2 c shredded mozzarella
- 1 lemon
- 3 c mariana sauce
- salt and pepper

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large pot of boiling water, cook shells until al dente.
- 2. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion, stirring occasionally. Add zucchini, garlic, salt, and pepper. Stir occasionally until zucchini is lightly browned and softened. Transfer to a large bowl and let cool.
- 3. Add ricotta, Parmesan, corn, basil, 1/2 c mozzarella, zest and juice from lemon, and cooled zucchini mixture to the bowl. Stir to combine and season with salt and pepper.
- 4. Spread marinara sauce in the bottom of a 9"x13" dish. Stuff each shell with about 2 Tbsp of mixture and arrange in a dish. Top with the remaining 1 c mozzarella.
- 5. Bake until cheese is beginning to brown and sauce is bubbling, about 25-30 minutes.


